

Party per bend vert and gules, charged with a bendlet argent. In front a four point star with 12 rays argent.

The colours scarlet, dark green and white denote the evolution of the Intelligence Branch from the Canadian Corps of Guides, the Canadian Intelligence Corps and the Canadian Forces Security Branch, respectively. The star is based on the silver North Star symbol embodied in the Canadian Intelligence Corps badge and thus further preserves historic ties. It is configured in the shape of a compass rose to draw notice to the world wide scope of the Branch responsibilities.

THE SECURITY BRANCH ASSOCIATION

What appears to be a deep dark secret is the existence and purpose of the Security Branch Association. No! No! ... not the Air Force Police association or the Provost Corps Association, but a Branch Association, for all of us.

What you ask? An Association for us? Why? Who needs it? What will it do for me, and for my section?

BACKGROUND

First, a little history. It has long been recognized by many Branch members that we needed some form of cohesion, some form of association to let us get on with what is called "Branch matters", (or dare I say regimental affairs). There has been some sporadic and isolated attempts to do this and some noteworthy results achieved. For example, the MP Newsletter has chugged along tirelessly and keeps us all informed about comings and goings and events of interest. Similarly the Canadian Forces Security Officers Association (now amalgamted with the Canadian Intelligence and Security Association - CISA) funded development of the Branch Flag and established the Kit Shop at CFSIS which is operated by the School on behalf of the Branch Association. The Officer's Association also funded a university bursary program for dependent children of all Branch members - not too important for those of us who have yet to know the joys of teenaged children, but of great benefit to anyone faced with the high cost of university tuition - a problem many of us will face eventually.

In short, there have been a lot of attempts and some successes in taking on projects which are of benefit to us all individually, or as a Branch. But there is much more that is not done, things that affect us individually, and our section. There was an evident need to form a Security Branch Association which, with support from all Branch members, could take on a number of projects, both large and small, of Branch and local interest.

In 1978 the Association was launched actively and a constitution approved in accordance with CFAO 27-8. In short order approximately 200 Branch members joined in and operating capital of approximately \$2000 has been accumulated. With the advent of the Branch split between Security and Intelligence, the time has come to get the Association into high gear.

ORGANIZATION

The Association is operated under the patronage of the Security Branch Adviser, Col R.T. HALL, who is also the Director of Security. There is an Executive Committee composed of officers and NCOs who, with input from Command Headquarters and bases, administer Association matters and finances. It is hoped that each Security Branch unit, element, or section will ultimately have an in-house representative. The present Executive consists of:

PURPOSE

The detailed purposes and procedures of the Association are contained in the Constitution, written in appropriate "bureaucratese", and probably buried somewhere in your Orderly Room. What then are some of the real-life aims or purposes of the Association? What are some examples of the things we hope to achieve?

- the Association can provide a focal point for Branch activities and developments by launching and conducting projects of interest throughout the Branch such as establishing and publishing a professional Branch newsletter or journal;
- to support and benefit members or groups of members in projects and endeavours which directly or indirectly benefit the Branch. For example, the Association could help fund expenses for presentation of plaques for such events as the Security Branch Team which attends the annual Royal Military Police March in England; to help fund the annual CFSIS bonspiel or similar events organized regionally or within Commands; or to fund individuals in such events as marathons or other activities which reflect creditably on the Branch as a whole;

- to sponsor trophies and awards for achievement in Security Branch endeavours; for example regional sports or recreational events, trophies for notable achievements such as competitions, TQ3 training, and a wide range of other activities.
- to assist in the preservation of Branch property and memorabilia near and dear to so many hearts. In this regard for example, the Association recently donated \$300 to the CFB Borden Museum for maintenance of Security Branch artifacts;
- and lastly to support local activities of interest and significance throughout the branch. No, this doesn't mean beer for Friday Happy Hours, but annual or one-time events such as special events, changeof-command ceremonies, special presentations, etc.

MEMBERSHIP

Membership is voluntary and is limited to Security Branch personnel, active or retired, regular or reserve. Membership cards will be issued and it is planned that members will each receive a "package" to include items such as embossed clipboards, MP pens, decals, etc.

FUNDING

We already have about \$2,000 in hand, and fees will be charged for each member, the maximum amounts being prescribed in CFAO 27-8 as shown below. These fees, now under examination by the Association Executive may be adjusted (downwards only):

Our campaign should be in high gear by 1 Oct 82, to coincide with the Branch split, by which time complete information packages, membership cards, posters and other details will be in your sections. The Association Executive is anxious to hear any and all proposals and suggestions and you are encouraged to submit these to the Executive via your Base Security Officer.

For many, this will be the first they've heard of the Security Branch Association. With your support and participation we can all ensure its success which will be of benefit to us individually and collectively.
